BACKGROUND

Blackfordby College of Agriculture was founded in 1974 (then as the Tobacco Training Institute) by members of the Zimbabwe Tobacco Association. One day seminars for farmers were introduced in 1976, followed by the inauguration of a tobacco diploma course in 1977. Following diversification out of tobacco by most commercial farmers, the Diploma in General Agriculture programme was introduced in 2000, which is currently the main course offered by Blackfordby. The college is situated on Klein Kopjes Farm in Concession, Mazowe District, Zimbabwe.

<u>DIPLOMA IN AGRICULTURE</u> (2 Years, Part Time)

The diploma programme consists of four **compulsory** disciplines namely Animal Production, Crop Production, Farm Mechanisation and Farm & Agribusiness Management – there is no specialization.

Applicants will be expected to have reasonable practical hands-on experience in a relevant agricultural setting as there is no provision for farm or agro-industrial attachment on this programme.

Teaching and learning will take place largely via virtual digital platforms. Field practicals, farm visits and limited face to face tuition will be undertaken on Saturdays only.

Each semester will consist of approximately sixteen (16) weeks, and the provisional calendar is as follows:

Semester 01	January 2026 to May 2026
Semester 02	July 2026 to November 2026
Semester 03	January 2027 to May 2027
Semester 04	July 2027 to November 2027

Crop Production: Tobacco Production, Soil Science, Botany, Weed Science, Summer Crops, Crop Protection, Principles of Horticulture, Winter Crops, Plantation Crops, Floriculture & Post Harvest Handling of Horticultural Crops

Animal Production: Animal Health, Animal Nutrition, Beef Production, Pig Production, Dairy Production, Poultry Production, Sheep & Goats Production, Aquaculture

Farm & Agribusiness Management: Land Use Planning, Geographic Information Systems & Remote Sensing, Agricultural Economics, Farm Budgeting, Farm & Agribusiness Mgt, Accounting, Labour Management, Agricultural Marketing, Agricultural Extension

Farm Mechanisation: Irrigation & Water Management, Tractor Power, Tillage Systems, Machinery Management, Energy Studies, Farm Machinery, Soil & Water Conservation, Agricultural Surveying

Entry Requirements

Minimum admission requirements for the Diploma in General Agriculture (Part Time) programme are:

- At least five (5) Ordinary Level passes including English, Maths and a Science subject (Grade C or better)
- Prior farming or any relevant work experience is a must

N.B. Only mature candidates will be considered for the Part Time study option!
